It is with great joy that we write this letter to you. Starting a new school year in our new campus, marks the achievement of a great milestone for the long term goals of Mt West Montessori school. We extend a warm welcome to all parents, we know that choosing and trusting a school for the care and work with your children is the most important choice you have as a parent. During this school year we hope you enjoy the process of your children's development. We recommend several things to help in this: observe their efforts, listen to what they say, understand their challenges as their independence grows specially during their transition into the school (when they cry!) and if you need help deciphering it all come and speak with any of us, we are glad to listen and share our thoughts with you. Remember that you are the most important guide your child has; it is in your hands and attitudes that your child's fate rests. To support you in this path of parenting we prepare special parent meetings throughout the school year. Make every effort to attend all of them, they are very important in the communication and understanding of the Montessori philosophy.

This October 21st we are hosting Trevor Eissler, author of the book *Montessori Madness*. He is married, has three children (in Montessori) and is an airplane pilot. He has written this wonderful book and has an awesome way of explaining from a parent-to-parent perspective, how the Montessori approach has impacted his family, why it works and the differences that he sees in traditional education and the Montessori approach. Don't miss it! As a parent I recommend you to pick up a book (it is an easy and fun reading book) now available at the office and attend the conference!

During the month we will be passing out information regarding our new **After School Program** most of the classes will be held right after school in our Multipurpose room or in our regular classrooms. Look for a brochure with content, costs and specific schedules for the classes coming soon. Here is a list of some of the classes:

- Suzuki Violin classes for children 4 yrs and above, held on Mondays 3 to 4 pm.
- Kinder-Music classes for children 2 to 4 years olds held on Thursdays 2:45 to 3:45 pm.
- Theater classes for 4 ½ and up held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:45 to 5 pm.
- Spanish Reading and Writing for Children's House students held on Tuesdays from 3 to 4 pm.
- English Language Arts for Elementary students and last year of children's house on Tuesdays and Thursdays. 3:30 to 4 pm.
- GET LIFTED: Cross fit for Parents. Schedules to be announced soon.

This month we begin with our Open Observations (October 26- Nov 13th). Open observations are intended to invite you to spend time at in your child's class, to come and see what and how the day at school is like. Both parents are invited and the observations are usually no more than 20 to 30 minutes. While observing, we invite you to observe only; there will be times to explore and communicate with your child and your child's guide. It is important and we invite you to notice other children, to observe the whole classroom environment, to observe the interaction between students, the children's body language, and to notice also how they communicate with the adults and among themselves. Observing is a wonderful way to learn. Observing is an art! This year we are holding both observations and parent teacher conferences on the same day so make a note of that in your schedules. We are recommending that your observations are done during the morning (9 to 11am) or afternoon (1-2:00 pm) working periods, however if you would like to observe their recess, their lunch period or their nap times you are welcome to do so. If your child started school recently (staggered entrance program) please sign up towards the end of the of the observation period, to allow your child enough time to transition in to the environment. Parents please can call the office and schedule both observations and parent teacher conference starting on October 19th

We are looking forward to the new Administration building, which should be ready to use early in the month of October. We hope you are enjoying the new campus as much as we are! Once again, receive a warm welcome to our school community! Have a wonderful month.

Dear Parents:

We would like to welcome you to our new 2009-2010 school year. It is a pleasure for us to have your children in the environment we have prepared for them with enthusiasm and love. We have seen the children enjoy their class.

All of the children are going through a process of adaptation; the ones that were already in the school because they are experiencing a new environment and guides, and the new ones because this is a new world for them. We are working very hard to help them as much as possible through this change and we ask you to please help them at home.

We thank those parents that came to our first meeting in which we talked about process of adaptation. For those parent's that couldn't come we encourage you to come to our meetings as they are very informative and helpful.

Next we are going to share some of themes we talked about during the meeting:

"During this process of adaptation it is very important for the guides, parents and children to work closely together.

The guide's responsibility is to have a well-prepared environment that is in order, attractive, and clean. It is her job to be a bridge between the material and the child and to welcome the child into the new environment with enthusiasm and demonstrate all that he can do within the environment.

The parents' role is to continue the work from school at home. Maintaining order and a routine, respecting the hours of work, permitting the repetition of things and over all a lot of love, patience, calmness and tolerance. It is important to include him in activities at home for example: making their bed, preparing food, folding clothes, etc. It makes them feel part of the family and have high self-esteem. Not only making them to participate in the physical, but emotional as well now that they are absorbing attitudes, habits, ideals and their contribution will be the same as the rest of the family (good or bad).

The work of the child is unconscious; the child at this time is developing 3 tendencies:

- Exploring: At the moment they enter the environment they want to touch, taste, feel and smell everything. Through his senses they will know everything in the environment and take control of it and make it part of themselves.

- Orientation: Now that the environment is always in order and everything has its own place. They can identify the materials.

- Adaptation: When the child feels that he is part of the environment, he makes it his own.

All of this is given in a natural way and a big part of it is because the environment is adequate to them by having everything in their reach, to their size, and with very few obstacles. Overall it depends on the support and love of the guides and parents.

Welcome again and we are looking forward to work very hard with your children.
